Retiree and Family Memberships – Invoiced \$125 quarterly on 7/1, 10/1, 1/1 and 4/1. Also invoiced \$20 each luncheon attended or Club 77 (that the Club pays for)

U30 – Must be under 30, maximum of two years at this level (will then need to move to full membership), required to participate in 2 volunteer opportunities each of the two years, required to join a committee, and to sponsor a new member. Invoiced \$150/quarterly on 7/1, 10/1, 1/1 and 4/1. The \$250 initiation fee is waived.

Individual Membership – Invoiced \$250 quarterly on 7/1, 10/1, 1/1 and 4/1.

Small Business Member – Invoiced \$1,250 annually on 7/1.

***Community Partner** – Invoiced \$2,250 annually on 7/1. Each additional member is \$1,000 annually. The \$250 initiation fee is waived.

****Corporate Membership** - Invoiced \$2,250 annually on 7/1. Each additional member is \$1,000 annually (prorated based on their member induction date).

Please note:

- All memberships are held by individuals and approved by the Rotary Club of Grand Rapids Board of Directors.
- Corporate Members, Small Business Members and Community Partners can elect to change the members that they pay for, but all new individuals must go through the membership approval process.
- Individuals removed from the above levels have the option to convert to an individual membership and pay their dues accordingly.
- Membership dues for new members will be prorated based on their member induction date.
